NHHA Hires New Armed Security Patrol

The Board of Directors of the Northwood Hills Homeowners Association carefully considers how membership funds are spent, as we are a voluntary association that must earn your support each year. We routinely analyze projects on their value, assess vendors on their performance and cost, and add benefits where possible. Safety and security are of the utmost importance and we allocate about 70% of our annual budget to this area. The Board has given extra attention to our security expenditures this year and performed a comprehensive financial and services review of our armed security patrol provider. After careful consideration, the Board determined changes were necessary to fulfill our commitment to members to spend funds wisely and provide maximum value.

NHHA is excited to announce, after months of due diligence, that we entered a services agreement in October with Top Gun Security (a division of United American Security). We selected Top Gun as our armed security patrol provider based in part on their references, their experience in large residential neighborhoods, the training they provide their officers, their well-marked patrol cars, the reasonable cost of

Winterize Your Home

Summer temperatures have a tendency to stretch into Fall in North Texas, but before you know it, freezing temperatures will arrive. Now is a good time to begin planning the steps you'll take to winterize your home. Here are some things to consider as we enter the colder months of the year:

- Clean your gutters. If your gutters are full of leaves and debris, they'll trap water from rainfall. When the first freeze happens, that water turns to ice, which can weigh down the gutters and cause them to pull away from the house.
- Service your furnace. A check-up can ensure your furnace will be functional all season long. After months of not being used, it's helpful to have it cleaned and inspected before you'll need it most. Don't forget to change your filter.
- Seal drafts. Weather-stripping and/or caulking your doors and windows is an affordable way to conserve energy and keep your home comfortable.
- Replace missing roof shingles and seal vents. If water penetrates your house through openings in the roof, it can be especially harmful in the winter if the water freezes in your attic.
- Prepare your outside faucets. Disconnect hoses and splitters from the spigot. Install a hose bib cover on each outdoor fixture.
- Check your fireplace. Consider having the chimney professionally cleaned to remove last year's build-up of creosote and ash. Inspect the interior for cracks and make sure the chimney cap is in good shape.
- Monitor your thermostat. If you're planning a holiday vacation, resist the temptation to turn off your thermostat while you're gone. You not only run the risk of freezing pipes if there's no heat in the house, but your system will have to work too hard to get things toasty again when you return. Lowering the temperature while you're away is safer than a dormant furnace.
- Pack up the patio furniture. It's unlikely you'll be spending much time outside in freezing temps, so pack up the patio furniture, or at least the cushions, and store them during the winter to extend their life.

National Good Neighbor Day

For the past few years, Northwood Hills Homeowners Association has celebrated National Good Neighbor Day by recognizing residents who exemplified what it means to be a Good Neighbor. We acknowledged the kind and thoughtful people living around us and expressed our gratitude for the sense of community we enjoy in our neighborhood. Last year, we expanded the program to acknowledge our nearby Dallas Fire & Rescue first responders for the Good Neighbors that they are. Our efforts facilitated the donation of more than \$8,000 worth of goods and gift cards from our residents and NHHA.

This year, the NHHA Board wanted to focus on the youngest among us. We decided to be a Good Neighbor to Medical City Children's Hospital on Forest Lane. This health care facility offers world-class pediatric specialties including congenital heart surgery, hematology and oncology, craniofacial surgery, kidney transplant, neurosurgery, and orthopedics. In addition, Medical City Children's Hospital

has urgent care and the highest level of neonatal care available in Dallas. After Hurricane Harvey ravaged South Texas earlier this year, a few patients were transferred to Medical City from affected areas.



When our young neighbors have to spend their birthday or a beloved holiday, or worse, years of their life, in the hospital, it can be especially devastating. NHHA wanted to facilitate bringing a smile to a young patient's face during a difficult time. We reached out to Medical City and learned that they are always in need of new children's toys, especially infant/toddler toys that light up and make sounds. Stuffed animals and arts and crafts kits were also in demand. After determining their needs, NHHA collected dozens of new toys from members. Donated funds were pooled with a monetary contribution from NHHA and used to purchase even more toys and stuffed animals.

NHHA Board Members Melinda Spence and Janet Marcum were honored to deliver the donations to Medical City Children's Hospital in early October. The residents of our wonderful neighborhood consistently show themselves to be generous, friendly, and caring. Thanks for supporting our National Good Neighbor Day initiative this year!

Why Wait? Your 2018 Membership Can Start Today

If you're contemplating joining the Northwood Hills Homeowners Association, don't wait 'til 2018...join right now and your membership starts immediately! Then you'll have access to the security patrol's out of town home check service during the holidays. Fill out the membership form on page 15 and mail it along with your check, or use the easy online membership form and FREE dues payment option at northwoodhills. org.

What do you get for \$300 a year? Besides access to the private armed security patrol, members receive MemberMails, which are email communications that relay important information about crime alerts, neighborhood events, community meetings, lost pets, code compliance, and city services. In your first year of membership, members receive a reflective alley address sign for the back fence or gate and a "No Solicitors" plague to mount near the doorbell. As needed, your curb address will be painted along with the custom NHHA logo for easy visibility. Membership also provides access to free paper shredding & electronics recycling events and entitles your household to a custom NHHA yard sign announcing our neighborhood's armed security and video surveillance. Lost and Found

Northwood Hills is an animal-friendly neighborhood, which is clearly evident on any fair weather day. This is why NHHA tries to facilitate a happy reunion if the unfortunate happens and a pet becomes lost. MemberMails concerning lost or found pets have high open rates and are generally successful. With that said, there are a lot of steps that pet owners can take to increase the likelihood of a quick and safe return of their lost furry family member, without the need for a MemberMail.

First and foremost, ensuring your pet is wearing a collar and ID tag is the best way to get him or her back home soon. Including your address on the tag, or at least a current phone number, is strongly recommended. Next, with the recent changes to pet registration by the City of Dallas, it's important to have your pet micro-chipped. Not only is it mandatory now, but it essentially means your pet is carrying ID wherever it goes. Most animal clinics can scan a found pet and determine ownership in a matter of seconds, if available. If you rescue a lost pet without an ID tag, we encourage you to visit a vet to check for a micro-chip. Northwood Veterinary Clinic on Peyton Dr. is close by and has helped numerous Northwood Hills' good Samaritans with scans in the past. They may even recognize the found pet if it's one of their patients!





It's good practice to know who lives around you and how to reach them, and it's a bonus to also be familiar with each other's animal occupants. Lastly, sharing info online can get the message out quickly when you've lost or found a pet. NextDoor and Facebook have proven effective in this area, especially when you want the information to travel outside your neighborhood boundaries.

NHHA is here to help, and you can contact us if we can be of assistance. But, if you follow the steps outlined above, you will hopefully experience a joyous reunion before you even have time to email us.

Want to find out if you're doing everything you could be in regards to security at your home? Residents can contact Senior Corporal Lindsey Allen with the Dallas Police Department to conduct a free Home Security Survey. She will walk your entire property, inside and out, and provide suggestions with a concept called crime prevention through environmental design. The process takes about an hour and is provided free of charge by DPD. NHHA Elects a New Treasurer





Renew your membership for 2018!

As we go to press with the Fall Breeze, real estate statistics in Northwood Hills may surprise you. When you look at the YTD numbers, our neighborhood is ahead of last year. Through October 2017, there have been forty-one homes sold and closed, and another five listings pending. That compares to a total of forty-six homes sold during the same period in 2016 – virtually a dead heat. Average home values rose from just over \$657,752 or \$175.47/sqft in 2016 to \$726,590 or \$185.06/sqft this year. Days on market reduced during that time from 55 days last year to just 43 days in 2017.

All of these statistics point to a hot market in full swing in Northwood Hills! So, why doesn't it feel that way? Home prices in North Texas increased an average of 40% over the last four years – far greater than income growth. At some point, the affordability index gets out of whack, meaning buyers lack the financial wherewithal to purchase a home at current prices.

Accordingly, in an October article, Dallas Morning News real estate editor Steve Brown wrote, "In case you missed it, the North Texas housing market has turned a corner. Oh, we've still got one of the best homebuying sectors in the country. Realtor.com in its latest ranking of the U.S. hottest home markets had D-FW on the same list with Silicon Valley and San Francisco as places where residential transactions are moving the fastest."

He continued, "While D-FW housing still looks good or even great compared to a lot of places around the nation, things have definitely cooled a bit from the last few years. There are fewer bidding wars for properties and buyers are more likely to turn their noses up at an overpriced address."

Local real estate agents report that sales of homes priced above \$500,000 are definitely slower than they were a year ago, while the under \$250,000 market [clearly not the Far North Dallas buyer], is still in overdrive.

2017 is still on track to be a record year with YTD purchases up four percent over last year. Dr. James Gaines, chief economist with the Texas A&M Real Estate Center tells us, "You've still got a good market – just a little slower than what we've seen recently. Things are getting back to normal." Gaines expects prices to keep rising next year, but probably not at the double-digit rate we experienced in the past four consecutive years.

So, while sales and prices in North Texas were higher in September than a year ago, the rate of increase in local housing activity is slowing, which analysts say is good for the market. The number of homes listed for sale in September was up 11% over the same month in 2016, another indicator the market is slowing a bit. According to Dr. Gaines, increased inventory is good. After all, nearly 40,000 people continue to move to North Texas annually. Currently there is about a three-month supply of homes in inventory which represents half of what would be considered a neutral market – neither favoring buyers nor sellers.

Experts are saying, "Don't be surprised if many buyers take time off from looking over the holidays this year – a deviation from recent years. And, sellers asking astronomical prices for their homes may find interest waning."

The market is ever-changing. If you are considering selling your home, ask your real estate professional for the most up-to-date market indicators, and price your home competitively right out of the chute!
