The increased traffic on Meandering Way, combined with the general conditions along that road, have made it dangerous for drivers and pedestrians alike. With school starting soon, concerned residents and parents want to increase the safety for kids walking to and from NHE and entering and exiting their cars.

In addition to the traffic concerns, residents would like to see ADA improvements to the existing sidewalk along Meandering Way and a sidewalk added to the west side of the street. Further, NHE would like to see improvements to school zone signage and crosswalks, and needs dedicated crossing guards during school drop off and pick up.

There are a lot of areas that need to be addressed and there are no easy fixes. But, the more voices that are added to the cause, the more likely the City of Dallas and the Dallas Police Department will listen. Zara Mishler, daughter of Randy and Elaine, graduated from Richardson High School and will be attending Mississippi State University in the fall to study Elementary Education.

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

Northwood Hills is fortunate to have an active, thriving real estate market. On any given weekend, one can meander through multiple open houses by following the signs that realtors place throughout the neighborhood, directing interested buyers to their listings. While the signs are temporary and usually small in size, realtors should still obtain permission from any homeowner whose property they wish to borrow for their advertising efforts. It might not seem like a big deal to some, but when signs are placed in people's yards, week after week, it can fester into a feeling of one's private property being repeatedly violated. Corner houses are especially vulnerable to unsolicited open house signs, which leads to those homeowners experiencing this problem again and again. If you are a realtor who does business in Northwood Hills, please respect your neighbors' private property by asking their permission before you or your associates places a sign in their yard. If you are a seller, please remind your realtor to extend this courtesy to your neighbors when they plan an open house. Real estate signs are the biggest offenders, but remember to follow the same etiquette with garage sale or commercial business signs.

Oak Wilt Education

Northwood Hills Homeowners Association has been following the oak wilt problem in Northwood Hills since 2008 and communicating its dangers to residents: publishing 14 stories in the Breeze newsletter, sending postcards and MemberMails, and posting on our website. The Association has also worked with an arborist since 2008 who has made dozens of trips through the neighborhood, as well as working with many residents individually. Rachel McGregor with the Texas A & M Forest Service recently visited Northwood Hills and confirmed the presence of oak wilt. She held an informational session and discussed prevention and treatment options to a crowd of about 35 concerned residents. Her strongest advice mirrored what NHHA has conveyed to residents numerous times - pruning of oak trees should be avoided from February to June and should be performed outside those months only by a licensed arborist using sterilized equipment, proper cuts, and proper sealing of wounds. Stop Poopin' Around

NHHA members take pride and great care in keeping Northwood Hills looking beautiful. I feel fortunate to be able to take in that beauty as I walk the neighborhood. There are many responsible pet owners in our neighborhood who clean up after their pets. Unfortunately, sometimes you see the result of man's best friend having deposited waste in one of our neighborhood yards. No one enjoys seeing a mound of dog poop in the yard they've worked hard to keep looking nice. As pet owners, it is our responsibility to clean up after our pets. Period. No exceptions. There are probably fewer things that aggravate neighbors more than a dog that "goes" in their yard. I am a dog owner and lover, but have to admit I don't love seeing people walking their dogs, talking on their cell phone with no waste bags in sight, wondering if my yard is to be targeted again. Some don't seem to know the City of Dallas ordinance that requires you to pick up your animal's waste on public or private property. It is also a violation of the ordinance if you are walking your dog and do not have something in your possession capable of picking up the waste.

What's the big deal? Doesn't the next rain wash it into the ground anyway? Actually it takes a long time to dissolve naturally by rain, and no one enjoys displaying a mound of poop in their front continued page 13

Real Estate

During the first half of 2016, Northwood Hills and all of north Dallas experienced a real estate market that was "hotter than a firecracker!" In fact, in my 27 years selling real estate in the Metroplex, I've never seen anything like it.

Since the beginning of the year, thirty-six properties have sold in Northwood Hills, ranging in value from \$365,000 to \$975,000. Remarkably, just over thirty percent of those properties sold at or above list price. Eleven properties sold between 100%-110% of asking price, most of which were on the market a week or less.

To put this into perspective, let's compare this activity to the same period in 2015. From the 1st of January 2015 through June 30th 2015, there were just twenty-two homes sold in Northwood Hills. Of those, only one went for over 100% of list price, at 100.32% of asking. Obviously this is a very different picture from today.

Some of the data associated with our home sales is a function of what homes are on the market at any given time. For example, in 2015, sold values ranged from \$282,000 to continued page 13




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\$1,590,000. Even so, average \$\$\$/sqft increased from \$159/ft in 2015, to just over \$170/ft in 2016. Average days on market reduced from 71 in 2015 to 56 days over the same time period in 2016. The homes selling over 100% of value this year averaged just ten days on the market.

To what can we attribute this frenzy of activity? There are still more buyers than there are available homes. As this article goes to press, there are just eighteen active listings in Northwood Hills. Given that thirty-six homes sold and closed in the first six months of this year, the active supply is just three months. In other words, if the market continues at the pace we have experienced in the first six months of 2016, the existing inventory would be sold out within three months. What makes this reality more stark is that the active listings in Northwood Hills range in value from \$349,900 to \$1,699,000. Obviously, with that wide of a range, all of the listings are not being viewed by the same buyers. This is not to say that other homes won't come on the market within the second half of the year. However, with corporations continuing to relocate to the Metroplex and hundreds of people moving to North Texas daily, the market does not appear to be slowing down, at least for the time being.

Interest rates have also remained low, which increases the purchasing power for buyers. The lower the interest rate, the more house a buyer can afford. As I work with buyers, I continue to get asked the questions, "don't you think the market is at the peak? Is this really a good time to buy, or continued page 14

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yard while they wait for the next thunderstorm. Rain or even hosing it into the ground is not the right answer. Dog waste is an EPA environmental pollutant just like oil, grease, and insecticides/ chemicals from urban runoffs. Storm water carries it directly into our natural waterways. The waste adds nitrogen to the water, which depletes the oxygen content needed for underwater grasses, wildlife and fish living in our neighborhood creek. Plus, the waste can contain roundworms and hookworms which live in the soil for long periods, presenting a hazard for humans. Other potential harmful organisms could be present that can be transmitted to kids, adults, and other animals who ingest water contaminated by waste runoff into our ponds, streams and creeks. Thank you to those who already do their part, but let's all clean up after our pets and keep the neighborhood we love looking beautiful.

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should we wait until the market slows down a bit?" Of course there is no crystal ball. But, until something drastic happens to alter the current conditions - low active inventory, low interest rates, and people moving to our great state in record numbers - I don't see much changing. We typically have some seasonal fluctuations, but all in all, I think for now, the market remains strong.
