### Hillcrest/Belt Line Eyesore Becomes Northwood Hills Gateway

There's a steep slope, a traffic control box, buried utilities, no irrigation and excessive vehicle pollution. But despite these obstacles and after months of work with the City of Dallas, the southwest corner of Belt Line and Hillcrest is now a Northwood Hills gateway median.

At the 2012 annual meeting, NHHA Members approved funds for improving the corner and/or the walls along Hillcrest and Belt Line. The wall clean-up turned out to be more involved and costly than expected, and will be addressed in 2013 if funds permit. But the corner project was within budget and work began this past spring.

"I've always thought we needed a neighborhood entrance marker there and now we finally have one,", said NHHA Member and Friends of Beautification supporter Linda West. "That corner is tricky with the utilities box, no water, and a thin, rocky, sloped area to work with but the use of decorative rock is a brilliant solution!"

## NHHA Beefs Up Holiday Patrols

December is statistically the number one month for residential burglaries. Once again this year, NHHA is adding security patrol shifts during the holiday season to augment the normal sevenday-a-week schedule. Additional shifts enable the officers to perform home security checks for Members who are out of town, while maintaining their regular street patrol and response to individual Members' calls.

"Out-of-town home check requests increase in December," said Glynn Newman, NHHA crime and security chairman. "Some days the officers may have 40 or more homes to check. The added shifts ensure they can get to all those homes as well as drive their street and alley patrol routes."

Northwood Hills contains 45 miles of streets and alleys. Barring an unusual incident and with an average number of out-of-town home checks, the officers cover every street and alley each shift.

### What's New in Northwood Hills Real Estate

The election results are in, and regardless of your party affiliation, it stands to reason we will be in for "more of the same." What does that mean to our local market in Northwood Hills? I recently attended FORECAST 2013 put on by the MetroTex Association of Realtors. Speakers included an SMU professor, an economist from the Real Estate Center at Texas A&M, and the Director of Federal Taxation for NAR (National Association of REALTORS), to name a few.

The event was very informative. According to the experts, Ben Bernanke has pledged to keep interest rates artificially low, at least through the end of 2014. We also know that come January 2013 tax rates may increase as a result of the expiration of the Bush tax cuts. Additionally, Obamacare, capital gains, dividend and estate tax increases, not to mention an income tax on foreclosure debt forgiveness, are being considered and if implemented could reduce disposable income for most homebuyers. According to many economists, worries of this "fiscal cliff" and relatively high unemployment present the real possibility of another recession.

The Dallas Area Metroplex continues to fare better than 95 percent of the markets nationwide. Consequently, Northwood Hills is faring well, too. Year-to-date sales in our neighborhood through the third quarter of 2012 are up more than 35 percent over 2011, with a total of 42 home sales as compared to 31 at this time a year ago. The average price/square foot is also up, from \$130.22 in 2011 to \$132.39 in 2012. But the biggest difference in our local market is the number of active homes for sale in our neighborhood. There are just 21 homes on the market, ranging in asking price from \$229,000 to \$799,000. Active listings in Northwood Hills have not been this low in over a decade.

If you add up all the pieces to our market puzzle, you might conclude that we are in a "hot" sellers' market. Remember, a sellers' market occurs when a market has less than a sixmonth supply of active inventory. Given that 42 homes have sold through the third quarter of the year, by definition, our neighborhood qualifies.

Because we compete with many other markets in North continued page 7



Dallas and beyond for buyers, I don't think we can jump to the sellers' market conclusion just yet. And, because the aforementioned economic changes could result in a reduction in disposable income, sellers should not anticipate major increases in value in the short term. However, real estate remains an extremely good investment in this volatile economic climate, and if you are waiting for appreciation on the home you own, I am afraid, the increase in value might coincide with interest rates, the likes of which we haven't seen in over 20 years. When interest rates get to a certain point, I believe that will slow the real estate market.

The moral of this story is that if you are looking to upsize, downsize, or oversize, you should accept the current value, and sell your home while the competition in our neighborhood is at a record low. That will enable you to move on to your new home taking advantage of a cost of money at a rate you are not likely to see ever again.





### Ready, Set....Prune!

Now through January, when our average temperatures are at the lowest, is the safest time to prune oak trees. Paint every cut, large or small, with pruning sealer or latex paint. For complete safety, clean all pruning implements with a 10 percent bleach solution or Lysol<sup>TM</sup> between trees.

Burning any type of oak wood will kill the oak wilt fungus, and there is no risk of spreading the disease through smoke. But storing unseasoned firewood from diseased red oaks is a potential means of spreading the oak wilt fungus. So it is best to buy wood that has been thoroughly dried for one full year.

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## How to Handle Holiday Waste

The holidays bring an excess of waste, and up to 70 percent of what is tossed out can be recycled. To reduce what ends up in the landfill, remember these items can be recycled: cardboard boxes, wrapping paper, gift bags and paper shopping bags.

NOT recyclable: stick-on bows, ribbon, packing peanuts and bubblewrap.


Watch MemberMail for the dates, times and locations of the City's Christmas tree recycling program. Bring your tree, bags and shovel and go home with free mulch.
