# Highlighting the Hills

What makes a neighborhood great? Real estate buffs will tell you location, location, location. Economists argue solid per capita income. Social activists will weigh in with community involvement. Politicians insist it's strong voter turnout. Residents who live on what's commonly referred to as "The Loop" seem to have made their section of Northwood Hills extraordinary by doing something simple - being good neighbors.

A person much wiser than myself once gifted me with a perspective that has somehow stuck with me over the years. He said that simple doesn't mean easy. Simple means that something is effortless to understand; easy means it's effortless to execute. To keep their part of the neighborhood great, The Loop - Oakbluff to Meadowcreek - does simple things, but things that aren't necessarily easy. They put effort into getting to know each other, getting together with each other, and living out what it means to be good neighbors. It's this continuous effort that ensures their slice of the neighborhood never loses its luster.

How this all started for The Loop was somewhat fortuitous, with several families moving in within a few months of each other, most having young children. With the current residents taking notice of the higher than normal turnover, it made sense to be proactive in meeting those folks new to the mix, creating a network effect. And it just built naturally from there, with additional families joining in and meeting not only the newbies, but other long-standing neighbors as well. It also helped that there had been a previous history of block parties and events spearheaded by longtime residents. Moving in gave everyone an address, building camaraderie with those other families close in proximity made them neighbors.

So, how does The Loop do it? What special sauce are they cooking with? NHHA Member Elizabeth Selzer struggles to find a good answer to what really makes her locale uniquely able to do what they do. Not that she doesn't believe she has been blessed with great neighbors but, in her mind, they are all just doing what they are supposed to do - no more, no less. The Loop has regular get-togethers on evenings and weekends, with a common theme of BYOE (Bring Your Own Everything) to make sure whole families can join in. BYOE means just that - kids bring their scooters, parents bring

chairs and drinks, with the host location being someone's lawn or outdoor space to keep things effortless both during and post-event. They also have periodic block parties, bringing together even more neighbors who may not be as active in smaller outings during the year.

One of the greatest benefits, Elizabeth believes, is a better understanding of generations within the neighborhood, which creates an appreciation of Northwood Hills' history

and those who have helped make it what it is today. Another is the piece-of-mind that she maintains knowing that nearly every house on The Loop is a safe place where her son could knock on the door and be welcomed. In an age of privacy fences, not to mention Dallas being one of the largest cities in the nation, I'll go out on a limb and say this is a rarity not just here, but anywhere.



The simple math of the equation is that being good neighbors helps the neighborhood as well as the individual resident. Not only does it make people sense, it checks a lot of other boxes as well. Even if you simply know your neighbors, basic human nature tells us that you are more likely than not to lend a helping hand when needed, or to keep a closer eye out for others' well-being, now that you're no longer strangers. In addition, property values have a better shot of maintaining their levels if you care not only about your own homestead, but also the folks' next door. Our ships rise and fall with the same tide, so to speak.

When all is said and done, your environment is what you decide to make it. Regardless of education, income level, political affiliation, race, religion, etc., we all can

If you are a customer who has not yet replaced your high-flow water-wasting toilets, you can apply to replace up to two of them. The free toilets provided by DWU ensure great performance and reduce water consumption. If you'd rather buy your own high-efficiency toilets, you can apply for a rebate option for up to \$90 per toilet. The rebate will be applied as a credit to your water account.

customer must submit a copy of a repair invoice, a written statement including dates and detailed descriptions, or complete a DWU Leak Affidavit Form. Only one adjustment per 12-month period is allowed. If an adjustment can be made, consumption will be adjusted accordingly after DWU calculates an average usage amount based on your account history. The customer will receive an updated invoice with the new balance. If the request is denied for any reason, a denial letter with explanation will be sent. Requests for leak adjustments may be submitted by email to leak. adjustments@dallascityhall.com. For more information, please call (214) 670-3178.

### **Sprinklers**

Before you turn back on your sprinkler system and start watering this spring, take advantage of a free automatic irrigation system check-up by a licensed landscape irrigation specialist. Watering too often and for too long is the primary source of water waste associated with landscape irrigation. You may be using a lot more water than your lawn needs, so let a specialist inspect your system

# **Shine Your Light**

The hills, winding streets and large trees of Northwood Hills contribute to it being a very dark neighborhood at night. We periodically field questions from residents about how to get the City to install street lights. In an existing neighborhood, the City won't install any new light poles at their expense; they would have to be paid for by homeowners. As a potential special project, NHHA investigated the cost of street lights a couple years ago, in hopes of being able to make a meaningful difference in the neighborhood.

Unfortunately, our research determined it would be cost prohibitive for the Association, and most likely the same for individual homeowners too. With estimated installation costs reaching thousands of dollars per light pole, plus the ongoing cost of electricity, there wouldn't be enough reserve funds available to pursue the project.

That doesn't mean homeowners can't make a noticeable difference in the neighborhood, however! To help with illumination, NHHA recommends motion-sensor lights for alley fences and back driveways, front-yard lighting, and porch lights. Not only will it help guests and emergency personnel find your home safely, it will deter crime. Criminals don't want to be seen committing their acts, so make your home bright and less enticing! We can light up Northwood Hills, house by house.

### Real Estate

Real estate sales statistics in Northwood Hills for 2018 were consistent with those we saw in 2017. We had fifty-five properties change hands this past year. The average sale price was \$691,142 or \$184.80/sqft, down slightly from the \$718,741 or \$184.77/sqft during the prior year. Given that the \$\$/sqft did not really fluctuate, it indicates the average size of the sold home in 2018 was smaller than the average home in 2017, by about 150sqft.

Average CDOM [Continuous Days on Market] stayed roughly the same, at 48 days.

There were some differences, however. The active listings inventory grew during the past year. For the better part of the second half of the year, we had anywhere from ten to twenty listings on the market, many of which were in the higher price points for our neighborhood. So, as we previously predicted, the higher priced homes that compete with areas outside of our neighborhood were slower to sell.

Another interesting statistic is we had 19 properties CANCELLED in 2018. When a property is cancelled, it is usually an indicator that the property has been on the market too long. Often times, the agent will suggest pulling it from the market for at least thirty-one days to get a "refresh" on CDOMs. After thirty-one days, the CDOM goes back to zero, essentially beginning the listing period over again.

Now with a market that has been as brisk as ours has been, one might ask, why would such a strategy be necessary? You may find the answer interesting.

Nineteen cancellations represents over thirty percent of the total number of SOLDs for the year. A few properties were continued page 12

and identify:

- Programming errors
- Leaks in the system
- Broken or misaligned equipment
- Problems with pressure
- Coverage problems

The irrigation specialist will also make recommendations such as:

- Programming suggestions
- Turf water requirements
- Possible equipment upgrades
- Repair and maintenance tips

# Dallas 311 is at Your Service

Despite NHHA's concerted efforts at curbing the placement of bulk trash out too early through neighborhood signage, emails, and reminders in the Breeze and on our website, there are still offenses occurring each month. While we continue to remain diligent, you can do your part, too!

The City of Dallas aims to turn every resident with a smart phone or tablet into a code officer, using an app that allows citizens to photograph and immediately file complaints in the 311 system. In addition to bulk trash violations, citizens can use the app to report high weeds; potholes; litter; a loose animal; obstruction of street, alley or sidewalk; illegal signs; graffiti; illegal dumping and junk vehicles; parking violations; stagnant water; watering violations; and substandard structures.




# Spring Cleaning Spiffs Alleys, Encourages Safety

Mark your calendar for the Northwood Hills April Alley Clean-Up days. This annual event on the weekend before the April Bulk Trash Collection begins is set for Saturday and Sunday, April 6 – 7.

Each homeowner is responsible for maintaining the area from their back property line to the center of the alley. That includes trimming bushes so they don't scrape cars or obstruct the alley. Trees that overhang the alley are required to be trimmed up 15 feet to allow clearance for garbage collection trucks.

Trash, debris, and stacked bags harbor pests, so use this opportunity to place them out for bulk trash collection. Clean alleys improve property values, deter criminal activity, and enhance safety. While you're out there, meet your alley neighbors. They are your allies in helping reduce alley crime.

This includes mowing, picking up litter and keeping overhanging trees trimmed up. 

## **Pet Policies**

On any given day in Northwood Hills, you will encounter dozens of neighbors out for walks, often with their dogs. It's safe to say that our residents enjoy having pets and I'd venture to guess the majority of NWH's pet-owners abide by City ordinances. In case you need a refresher on animal laws in the City of Dallas though, here's a quick run-down:

- Pet registration has been replaced with mandatory microchipping for dogs and cats.
- An owner of a dog or cat commits an offense if the pet is not currently vaccinated and if the pet is not wearing a collar with a current rabies tag attached to it.
- An owner commits an offense if the owner fails to restrain their animal, at all times, in a fenced yard, or in an enclosed pen, or in a structure, or with a leash while in their immediate possession.
- An owner commits an offense if the owner restrains their animal without providing access, at all times, to potable water and shelter.
- A person commits an offense if he transports an animal within the open bed of any moving pickup, flatbed, or similar vehicle, without the animal being in a carrier or continued page 11

other sufficient device to keep the animal from falling from the vehicle.

- You may have no more than four dogs and/or cats if you live in an apartment, duplex, or town home. You may have no more than six dogs and/or cats if you live in a single family home on a lot less than half an acre in size.
- All pet owners must remove, in an immediate and sanitary manner, any feces created by their pet on public property or any private property not owned, leased, or controlled by the animal owner. The animal owner must have a device in their possession for the safe and sanitary removal and disposal of their pet's feces.
- A person commits an offense if he owns a live rooster on any premises within the City.

cancelled more than once. Some were cancelled and then re-entered the market with a different listing agent. In most cases, when the properties came back on the market, there was a price reduction. Some of these properties are still on the market. There are properties that dropped by over one hundred thousand dollars before they were successful in selling.

When properties are perceived by ready, able and willing buyers as being priced that far over the market value, they will sit. When sellers get serious and decide they want to sell, the educated and savvy, ready, able and willing buyers will decide what they are willing to pay for a property. The longer a property is on the market, the less it is worth. I have seen over and over again properties that start out unreasonably priced ultimately selling for most likely less than they would have if they were priced right to begin with.

The 2019 market remains to be seen. "Record home prices and higher mortgage rates caused some buyers to hit the pause button in North Texas. The spring housing market will determine where things are headed," said Steve Brown, real estate editor for The Dallas Morning News.

January MLS reports for Far North Dallas demonstrate a reduction in the average closing price, as well as the price/sqft, and an increase in average days on the market. Only time will tell if this trend will continue.

# **Protecting Trees in Northwood Hills**

February was the beginning of the oak wilt danger season, when live oaks and red oaks are highly susceptible to the disease caused by the fungus Ceratocystis fagacearum. Treatment is expensive and rarely works, but prevention is effective. Arborists say: Don't prune oak trees during the high-risk season.

Oak wilt is spread when sap-feeding beetles carry the fungus spores from a diseased tree to a wound on a healthy tree. Cutting limbs during the months when the fungus is active is inviting oak wilt, and the mortality rate for infected trees is nearly 100 percent. Once a tree is infected, the disease can also be transmitted through the root system, especially in live oaks – possibly working its way across the street and down the block.

NHHA encourages all Northwood Hills residents to observe the suggested "no pruning" season of February through June. Outside of those months, pruning should be performed only by a licensed arborist using sterilized equipment, proper cuts, and proper sealing of wounds.
