# A Well-Earned Retirement

"Sharon must be on a different route today," you think to yourself while reviewing the pile of mail on the counter - a letter for a neighbor found its way into your mailbox. This is not an unfamiliar scenario for many residents in the western portion of Northwood Hills, who USPS letter carrier, Sharon Lenamond, served for years. When she wasn't delivering on a particular day, they knew it.

Originally from Nebraska, Sharon and her family have spent a majority of their lives in Texas, with their roots running deep in public service via the USPS. Between her husband, grandfather, and a few uncles, it's safe to say that the family has put in well over 100 years of hard work in various communities through their dedication to postal delivery. And, if you were on Sharon's route prior to her recent retirement after 42 years of faithful service to the community, it's a safe bet that even if you didn't know her, she sure knew you.

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# **Advocacy**

As a voluntary homeowners association, NHHA is not an enforcement agency. We can't compel membership or require adherence to local ordinances. However, we work to educate residents about neighborhood issues and code compliance, and help them escalate concerns when appropriate. In 2020 we assisted dozens of residents with questions, coordinated with other local HOAs, spoke with or provided contact information for City officials when necessary, and disseminated helpful information in The Breeze and inside MemberMails. We are happy to help when possible, but we also encourage our residents to work with their neighbors when problems arise and use 311 when the City's assistance is needed. As a reminder, the NHHA Board is entirely made up of volunteers, and our goal with advocacy is to inform and empower.

# Crime In Our Neighborhood

Security in Northwood Hills is a primary concern for most residents and a major focus of NHHA efforts and funding. In fact, around 80 percent of membership dues will be allocated to security patrol services in 2021.

NHHA tracks incidents of Burglary, Burglary of a Motor Vehicle (BMV), Criminal Mischief, Theft, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle (UUMV), Assault, and Robbery. In 2020, there were 61 total reported criminal incidents in Northwood Hills, with Thefts and BMVs making up the majority at a combined total of 41.

Although these are often classified as "minor" offenses, they're certainly not minor if they happen to you. We continue to work with GardaWorld patrol officers to make sure we're all doing everything possible to prevent crime. The officers provide valuable feedback about what they see "on the street," including cars with valuables left inside or parked on the street for multiple days; doors, garages, or gates left unlocked or ajar; lawn equipment and bikes left out in the open; and exterior security lighting that isn't working.

There has been a recent uptick in BMVs happening to work vehicles, as they are often left unattended with valuable equipment inside. These crimes of opportunity are usually carried out very quickly, sometimes with devastating financial consequences to the victims.

NHHA has distributed numerous communications over the past few years with tips on how to avoid becoming a victim. Through articles in the Breeze, security snapshots and crime alerts in MemberMails, and a Crime and Security Guidebook available on our website, we work diligently to educate our residents. Our best advice is to make yourself a hard target. Let's work together to reduce crime in Northwood Hills!

# Are You Walking on the Wild Side?

Many Northwood Hills residents enjoy taking scenic walks in our beautiful neighborhood. Some also enjoy having their beloved pets by their side. But, is there a correct side of the street to walk?

Unlike cars and bicycles, there are no formal rules as to which side of the street one must walk. However, there are some practical safety guidelines to consider. The majority view is that one should always walk on the side facing traffic when there is no sidewalk available. It is thought to be safer to see what is coming, especially if you might be distracted by your phone or listening to music.

Let me explain why this also makes sense when you walk your dog. Dog trainers, for either obedience or guide canines, will train to have your dog on your left side (unless there is a physical issue with the owner's left hand or arm). Interestingly, this traces back to the military, where the highest ranking officer is positioned to the right of their troops. Since you rank higher than your dog, you walk to the right and the dog walks to your left. Walking on the left side of the road enables you to be a barrier between your dog and continued page 5





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any oncoming traffic, thereby reducing the chance of your dog being injured.

So, while you are ultimately the master of which side of the road you choose to walk, just remember it is safer to walk on the left, looking at oncoming traffic, with your pet to your left side.



# **Spring Is Around the Corner**

Mark your calendar for the Northwood Hills April Alley Clean-Up days. This annual event on the weekend before the April Bulk Trash Collection begins is set for Saturday and Sunday, April 10 – 11.

Each homeowner is responsible for maintaining the area from their back property line to the center of the alley. That includes trimming bushes so they don't scrape cars or obstruct the alley. Trees that overhang the alley are required to be trimmed up 15 feet to allow clearance for garbage collection trucks.

Trash, debris, and stacked bags harbor pests, so use this opportunity to place them out for bulk trash collection. Clean alleys improve property values, deter criminal activity, and enhance safety. While you're out there, meet your alley neighbors. They are your allies in helping reduce alley crime.




### Real Estate

Covid19 made the year 2020 quite a roller coaster ride, both in our daily lives and in the real estate market. This was true for both the DFW area in general and our favorite little corner of that area. Northwood Hills. How these events affected the real estate market is a question that I think interests most homeowners, whether they live in NWH or not. Any home owner is interested in at least two things: the probable sales price if they decided to sell now and how long their home would be on the market (with showings and other inconveniences) before they could close. Of course, the answer to these two questions depends not only on local market conditions but also on the specifics of your home. Only an experienced and capable real estate agent can help you when you are contemplating selling your home but statistics can give you a general idea that could later be fleshed out by discussion with your realtor.

First let's look at how our neighborhood did in 2020 compared to 2019. The table below captures some key market statistics and the percent change from 2019 to 2020. They all show a good trend except perhaps the median cumulative days on the market (CDOM). Unlike the other stats, where upward trends are good, CDOM is like a golf continued page 7





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score, lower is better. That having been said, it should be pointed out that although the median CDOM went up by over 62% it is still very short. And in general prices and number of properties sold went up by a healthy percentage, despite the pandemic. That's very good.

# District 11 Council Seat Up for Grabs



# New to Northwood Hills?

Did you purchase a home in Northwood Hills in 2020? If so, you may qualify to receive a homestead exemption from the Dallas Central Appraisal District. To be eligible, you must have owned and occupied your home as your principal residence as of January 1, 2021 and not received a homestead exemption on any other property in Texas or in another state. The homestead exemption entitles you to a \$25,000 reduction in taxable value for school tax purposes and other potential reductions up to 20% of value for counties, cities, and special taxing districts. Other exemptions available to homeowners include: Age 65 or older or Disabled; 100% Disabled Veteran or Surviving Spouse; and Partially Disabled Veterans. The deadline for filing a Residence Homestead Exemption Application is April 30 of the year for which you are claiming the exemption. Late applications will be accepted if filed no later than 2 years after the tax delinquency date for the tax year you are claiming the exemption. If you are a single or married homeowner filing together, you may be eligible to apply online. There is no fee to file an exemption application (or late exemption application). 

### Real Estate

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Keep in mind that the data from the TAMU Real Estate Center is an average over the entire DFW area and therefore the sales prices are much lower than in our neighborhood. The key take home from these numbers is the trend year over year. Also, there is no CDOM statistic in their data instead of CDOM they use a statistic called Months of Inventory to get at the time that it takes for homes to sell in a given area. Simple, right? Not so much. The calculation of this number for a given period of time is a rather sophisticated statistical operation because the inputs are randomly varying over time and homes that sell with CDOMS significantly less a month add another layer of complexity. For that reason you will normally see this number quoted only in reports prepared by teams of experts like TAMU Real Estate Center. If done correctly it gives us a similar feel for the market that mean or median CDOM does. Looking at both tables above gives us a very good feeling about DFW and more specifically NWH real estate markets.
