Hillcrest Corner Gets a Fresh Look

When NHHA asked for resident feedback in 2020, the unsightly condition of the southwest corner at Belt Line and Hillcrest was mentioned often! This location presents unique challenges for our Beautification efforts. There's a steep slope, a traffic control box, buried utilities, no irrigation, and excessive vehicle pollution. Luckily, Mark Guckian, owner of Art That Grows, had a vision for our space. His team removed the existing dark red lava rock from three beds and replaced them with Liriope directly underneath the marker sign and Mexican Feather grass in the others. These plants were purposefully chosen for their drought-tolerant nature. They also topped each bed off with a different type of gravel, called Apache Red, to provide a nice finish while the plants get established, and to help with weed control. The contrast in stone color and addition of greenery softened what was previously a stark landscape. With no access to irrigation at that corner, NHHA had to rely on the generosity of the nearby Carter Family to borrow water during the initial planting stage!

They had purchased a nice three bedroom home, but Barbara decided she wanted something bigger and nicer. She discovered Northwood Hills. Homes were already being built east of Hillcrest and there were several available lots. In speaking to the developer, George Mixon, she learned of his plans to build luxury homes on larger lots west of Hillcrest in Northwood Hills Estates. Barbara was sold, but she had to sell Bill to move after only a year. It wasn't difficult.

A few days later, Bill was sitting down with Mr. Mixon to close the deal on the first lot sold in Northwood Hills Estates. Bill paid \$15,000 cash in 1963 for the lot and told Mr. Mixon that he thought he just bought the best lot in Dallas. Mr. Mixon replied, "Son, you just bought one of the best lots in the world." Bill's lot today is valued by Dallas County at \$365,000. Quite the increase in land value in 58 years.

In 1963, the neighborhood landscape was much different. Imagine if you will, Northwood Hills Estates west of the creek being all grassy fields with only one tree – an old Bodark ("horse apple") tree next to Bill's lot (i.e., my lot). In the 1960s, LBJ or I-635 didn't even exist west of US-75. Preston, Spring Valley, and Beltline were all two-lane asphalt roads. Westbound Spring Valley stopped at the creek (where the bridge is today). Hillcrest was a continued page 6



packed gravel dirt road. Access to Northwood Hills Estates was only via Meadowcreek at the time. Meadowcreek was only paved between Hillcrest and Dartbrook: Dartbrook was only paved about 10 yards past Bill's lot. The rest of the streets in the neighborhood were dirt roads.

Excited about their purchase, Barbara painted Bill a picture of her dream house (she later insisted on a fountain in the front of the house, which Bill gladly obliged). With only one tree for miles near Bill's lot, Bill planted the first trees in our subdivision. They were the start of what makes our neighborhood beautiful.

Often unconventional and relying on the "can do" approach he learned as a young boy working various jobs, Bill drew up his own plans for the house she painted. He was determined to be the general contractor and build the house himself. His next step was to get a building loan. Being relatively new to Dallas, Bill did not have banking relationships. His banker at Prudential was very concerned Bill was going to attempt to build it himself without a background in construction and also concerned whether he could afford the \$228 a month payment.

All it took was one phone call to Bill's boss, the president of Hysan Chemical. Bill passed the phone to the Prudential banker and his boss told the banker to make the









In April, the crew at Fretz Fire Station 56 participated in a special event to commemorate adding a new engine to their fleet. The "push-in ceremony" honors a longstanding fire service tradition dating back to the 1800s, when fire departments used handdrawn pumpers and horse-drawn equipment. Upon returning to the station after a fire call, the horses could not easily back the equipment into the station. They were disconnected from the fire equipment and firefighters would push the equipment back into the bays themselves. Today, the ceremony signifies retiring an old engine and putting a new engine into service.

loan, as Bill could easily afford it. After all, he was the top salesman in the country. A few minutes later the loan was signed.

The house was built in about a year with thick plaster walls, hard as concrete. As such, it is far better insulated than many newer homes and stays cooler during the hot Dallas summers with below average electricity usage. The house is amazingly sturdy. As we were walking down his stairs, Bill encouraged me to pound on the walls; "you can't hurt these John, they're solid."

Once the house was built, Bill and Barbara felt like they were living in the country instead of a big city like Dallas. When they wanted to go out for dinner, there were not many close options. The nearest place to get Pizza was Pizza Villa at Beltline and Central, which had opened in 1960 and eventually closed on New Year's continued page 8

Eve 2014. The closest place for chicken was a Church's chicken at Arapaho and Custer, which was also where the nearest ice cream could be found – Baskin Robbins. However, filling up your car with gas was not as much of a drive. The intersection at Beltline and Coit had a gas station on each corner of the intersection, but no stoplights - it was a roundabout. Bill remembers wrecks happening there all the time. No one understood how to yield at the roundabout and as a consequence there were lots of fender benders. Back then, gas stations were also repair shops and they had a ready supply of customers right in front of them.

Bill and Barbara's son Scott attended Northwood Hills Elementary (NHE). In the 1970s, Bill's wife Barbara died of cancer. It was a sad time for Bill and Scott, but in 1980, Bill married his current wife, Jeana. Jeana brought joy back to their home. If you know Jeana, you know she is a very positive person. She told me she loves Northwood Hills as much as Bill. She explained, "of course the area is beautiful with all the well-kept yards, but what I enjoy the most is how nice the people of the neighborhood are." You can find Jeana most mornings walking the neighborhood streets near their house with a smile on her face.

Few know that for over 35 years, Bill has provided snacks (soft continued page 9

drinks and cookies) to Dallas city trash-collecting employees. The family who has cared for his lawn and his cleaning lady have also been with him for 35 years. Bill thinks of them like family and has not missed a week of paying them, even during the pandemic. When I asked Bill what motivates him to give back to those less fortunate, he immediately recalls the story of making 25 cents an hour in the nursery and his boss buying him a lunch Bill could not afford. He went on to say "everyone wants someone to care about them, and I care".

As Bill's next door neighbor, my family came to know and love Bill over the years. I hate to say we took down that original Bodark tree in 1998 because my labs kept eating the horse apples. When my kids were young they all loved to play basketball and occasionally the ball would go over the fence into "Mr. Stanley's" yard. They were at first afraid to go ask for it. That quickly changed when Bill gave them candy every time it happened. Bill knew our two labs, Mac and Weezie, loved to retrieve bumpers and balls. Every couple of weeks there was a bag of used tennis balls on our driveway for them. In 2000, my wife and I talked about moving from Northwood Hills after 9 years, but my 12 year old son said, "Dad, we can't leave Mr. Stanley". 



Real Estate

I will begin by making a broad general statement. After 32+ years in real estate, I can confidently say, "your home is worth more now than it has ever been!" Home prices across the country rose at the fastest rate since 2006, according to the folks at CoreLogic. Dallas home prices were up 10.7% from March a year ago, just prior to the start of shelter-inplace.

Jeff Rohde of Roofstock predicts Dallas median home prices to grow by nearly 16% by the end of the year. Above-average population of millennials, robust in-bound population growth, a thriving economy, and affordable and accessible real estate options make DFW a hot market now and a prime spot into the future.


The Dallas metropolitan area population grew by nearly 2%over the last year, helping Texas add more residents than any other state in the U.S. in 2020, according to Rohde.

D Magazine describes the Dallas real estate market as "the weirdest ever." Homes are selling at a frenzied pace, with more than half the homes in Dallas receiving multiple offers, during most of the last year. Scores of out-of-towners are moving to DFW from high cost of living areas such as New York and San Francisco.

Home values in Dallas increased by 6.9% last year and are projected to grow by another 11.1% during the next 12 months. Single family median prices have increased by 13% year-over-year. During that same time, active listings have decreased by 55%.

Given all this great news, how does Northwood Hills fare in comparison? Average sale prices in our neighborhood increased 13.5% year-over-year through the first quarter. Nineteen homes sold and closed during the first three months of 2021, as compared to just fourteen a year ago. Four homes sold for at least 100% of value, indicating multiple interest and most likely multiple offers. Days on Market [DOM] reduced from 84 days a year ago, to just 61 days during the first quarter of this year.

As this issue of the Breeze goes to print, the April numbers have just come in. If we add April to the mix, the numbers are even more compelling. Last April was the first full month of shelter-in-place and it took realtors some time to navigate continued page 15
