# Member Benefit: Security Patrol

One of the main benefits provided by Northwood Hills Homeowners Association is the armed security officers who patrol the neighborhood to provide security, improve safety, perform out of town home checks, and deter criminal activity. Our current provider, GardaWorld Security Services, is the largest privately-owned security services and business solutions company in the world. Officers in well-marked cars are patrolling the neighborhood 2 shifts a day, 7 days a week, for a total of 112 hours. They carry a tablet in their cars, so they have quick access to email and member contact information. They also answer the members-only security phone when on duty.

If you're a current member, use the Out of Town Home Check form on our website when you travel. That provides one daytime and one overnight check of your residence each day while you're away. If you're not a member, what are you waiting for? The more members we have, the more security coverage we can provide.

# **Stop the Spread**

It's hard to step outside for even a moment these days without getting a visit from a mosquito or two. The familiar resulting itch lets you know you've been a target, but it's not just that minor annoyance we need to try and avoid. West Nile Virus (WNV) is most commonly transmitted to humans by mosquitoes. While most people will exhibit no symptoms after contracting it, and only about 20% will develop a fever with other symptoms, there is a small possibility that WNV can lead to a serious, sometimes fatal, neurologic illness. Over the past few years, multiple people have died in Dallas County as a result of the virus.

There are no medications to treat a WNV infection, so prevention is key. Remember the Four D's:

**DEET:** Use insect repellants that contain DEET or other EPA-approved repellants. Whenever you're outside, even for a short time, protect yourself.

**DRESS:** Wear long, loose, light-colored clothing when outside.

# Early Characters in NWH History

These stories stem from John's sit-down with Jim Kimmel, an original homeowner in Northwood Hills. The first article in the series was published in the Winter 2022 edition of the Breeze.

Jim Kimmel has been a resident of Northwood Hills for over 60 years. He has lived in several areas of Dallas, including Highland Park and Preston Hollow, but Northwood Hills is the best in his opinion. Jim discussed some of his more interesting memories of Northwood Hills, one of which involved Lee Harvey Oswald.

The city of Dallas and the Nation was shaken; President John F. Kennedy had been assassinated November 22, 1963. The alleged assassin, Lee Harvey Oswald, was gunned down by Jack Ruby in front of a live television audience less



than 48 hours later. Ruby was believed to have connections to organized crime. Conspiracy theories on the assassination and beliefs of multiple shooters began to take shape. With two murders and talks of Russian agents and organized crime, tensions were high. The citizens of Dallas were on edge. Newly sworn-in President Lyndon Johnson quickly established the Warren Commission to investigate the assassination in an attempt to find answers to the conspiracy questions and calm the Nation.

Jim Kimmel was headed home after a long day at work. He was a home builder and Dallas houses were in demand. Jim was looking forward to seeing his wife Sue and relaxing in their relatively new home he had built in the Northwood Hills suburb of Dallas. At the time, Northwood Hills was not very populated north of Spring Valley. Brookcrest was only a block long with Spring Valley at one end and a dead end at the other. As he turned into his driveway at 14068 Brookcrest, he could see Sue looking out the window. Normally she would be in the kitchen making dinner at this time or taking care of their three young children, but something else had her attention tonight.

Jim greeted Sue and she immediately told him she had seen some strange men she didn't recognize on the street earlier

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in the day and pointed to a parked car, next to an open lot. He could tell from her voice she was nervous. Their street did not have many houses at the time and they knew all of their neighbors. It was unusual for Jim and Sue not to recognize the cars on the street. There was a man in the front seat of the parked car and Sue told Jim he had been there for several hours.

Jim went to his closet and pulled out his .38 revolver from the top shelf. He checked to make sure it was loaded and tucked the gun under his belt. The cold steel of his pistol was not exactly comfortable as he opened the front door on a chilly Dallas evening.

Jim did his best to appear casual as he took his normal evening walk. As he approached the car in question, Jim calmly pulled his revolver out from under his belt and held it close to his side. He was careful to make sure no one could see him walking with his gun drawn.

As Jim approached the car, he could see the driver's side window was down. At the moment he drew even with the window, he quickly raised his revolver, whirled around to face the driver, and shouted, "WHAT ARE YOU DOING HERE?" The startled driver's head almost hit the roof of the car, but he immediately raised both hands and said, "Don't shoot. I'm FBI."

Jim kept his revolver trained on the man and told him, "OK, let me see your badge...move very slowly." The FBI agent was happy to comply and carefully produced his identification. Jim lowered his weapon as the agent told him they were watching the Fords' home, which happened to be across the street from Jim's home. Apparently, Marina, the wife of the slain Lee Harvey Oswald, was staying with the Fords again. The FBI was concerned she might be an assassination target and was protecting her until she had completed her testimony for the Warren Commission. Satisfied with the explanation, Jim tucked his revolver back under his belt and walked home to tell Sue what was going on.

Few people knew Marina was living with the Fords, but Jim and Sue knew. The Oswalds had lived there for a couple of weeks prior to the Kennedy Assassination. The home, owned by Mr. Declan Ford, was easily visible from Jim's front window. In 1960, Declan had married a Russian, Katya Skotnicki, who had recently divorced US Army Private Stanley Skotnicki after settling in the USA and gaining her

# **Stop the Spread**

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**DRAIN:** Remove any standing water. Change water in birdbaths, fountains and plant saucers often. Clean gutters so leaves can't hold moisture. Use mosquito dunks where necessary.

**DUSK/DAWN:** Consider staying indoors during dusk and dawn hours when mosquitoes are most active.

The City of Dallas is working to prevent the spread of mosquito-transmitted diseases through their Mosquito Control Program. They trap and collect mosquitoes for testing, monitor known breeding sites and apply larvicide, punish Code violations of standing water, treat storm drains, disseminate educational materials, and spray for West Nile Virus in neighborhoods when mosquito pools test positive.

When WNV is confirmed, spraying typically occurs overnight between 9pm and 5am. Residents are encouraged to stay indoors during that time to avoid contact with the spray. The trucks drive down residential streets but do not travel in the alleys. If your pet uses an outdoor water bowl, you should clean it out and replace the water after a spraying. NHHA Members receive email alerts when the City is scheduled to spray inside Northwood Hills.

All mosquitoes need water to reproduce, so the best thing you

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citizenship. Katya's birth name was Katharina Jeustrotova. Marina Oswald, who was born in Russia and emigrated to the US with Lee Harvey, was close friends with Katya. The Fords often had parties and invited their neighbors. Jim said their parties were fun, however, "the only problem was most of the people there were Russian and they only understood Russian!" He also never tried to socialize with Lee Harvey at the Ford parties, because as he was a deserter, Jim felt he was "the lowest of the low."

Coincidentally, Lee Harvey Oswald was buried in the same cemetery (Shannon Rose Hill) as several of Jim's relatives. The location of Oswald's grave was kept secret for years. Jim would occasionally pay respect to his relatives there and tried to find out the location of Oswald's grave, but was unable. Patric Abedin of Fort Worth, who saw President Kennedy at Carswell Air Force Base, was able to find the



location of Oswald's grave and purchased the plot next to it for \$175 in 1975. He had the headstone engraved with the name "Nick Beef," which was a longheld persona of his, used as a joke. The grave of Nick Beef remains empty today.

Note: according to a CIA memorandum in 1960, the agency was becoming increasingly interested in watching a pattern of Soviet women marrying foreigners, being permitted to leave the USSR, then eventually divorcing their spouses and settling down abroad without returning home. Katya and Marina fit that pattern.

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
#### Lone Star Team Success

The worst offenders are unkempt swimming pools, stagnant ponds, birdbaths, empty containers that collect rainwater, clogged gutters, and French drains. If you can't empty the water, use a mosquito dunk. NHHA has some on hand to help stop the spread of mosquitotransmitted diseases. Reach out to us if you'd like a free one.

If you notice standing water in ditches, vacant lots or on neighborhood property, please report it to 311. Remember the Four D's, keep an eye on your property, and be on the lookout for problem areas around you. Together we can work to stop the spread.

# Can 311 Help With That?

NHHA Board Members periodically field calls from residents, asking for help with neighborhood code issues. Since NHHA is a voluntary organization with no enforcement capabilities, we have to defer to the City of Dallas for resolution. But, there's an app for that!

The City of Dallas aims to turn every resident with a smart phone or tablet into a code officer, using an app that allows citizens to photograph and immediately file complaints in the 311 system. In addition to bulk trash violations, citizens can use the app to report high weeds; potholes; litter; a loose animal; obstruction of street, alley or sidewalk; illegal signs; graffiti; illegal dumping and junk vehicles; parking violations; stagnant water; watering violations; and substandard structures.

Download the OurDallas app on your smart phone. You can also call 311 directly or submit an online service request from your computer at https://dallascityhall.com/services/311. Not sure if your issue is covered by 311? Call them and ask!

Let's use the resources available to us so we can work together to keep our neighborhood safe, clean, and welcoming.

# Real Estate Report

There is no doubt that the Northwood Hills market has seen unprecedented growth even compared to last year's growth over 2020, which was in itself pretty remarkable. Just look at the table below. It shows 7 key statistics for the period from January through April for last year compared to this year along with the percentage change in those numbers:

The stats you want to see rise did in fact rise, by some pretty spectacular percentages, and the things you want to see fall did, in fact, fall. That's good—very good. The number of homes sold actually fell, but anecdotal evidence I have collected from my contacts tells me that the cause for that might be that many would like to sell but wonder if they can find something affordable and suitable to move to. A slightly cooling housing market might paradoxically cause more homes to sell but at a lower price increase. The median sales price is up by 31.7% and the mean/average is up by a whopping 41.7%. That may reflect the increase in the top end of the price range of course but the median price per square foot is up by a full 37% too. And look at the days on the market: blink and it's gone. Homes in our neighborhood are selling like hotcakes.

How will the Fed's inflation-taming efforts affect the housing market? Of course, I'm not an economist but I have been in this business for over 30 years and I have seen how interest rates affect the housing market. It's pretty easy to see why they do. If the mortgage rate goes up (as they usually do when the Fed bumps the federal funds rate) that means that the monthly payment goes up for the same amount borrowed. So, the amount that the average prospective home buyer can afford goes down. Earlier this year, in March, the Fed gave a gentle tap on the interest rate with a quarter point

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increase. That was the first increase since 2018. Then, again, on the 4th of May, they gave it another boost, much less gentle this time—a 0.5% increase. This is bound to have an impact on housing markets. We'll have to wait and see how much, but with any luck it will only cool the market a bit, which could even be considered healthy.

Hours of operation are Tuesday 9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Wednesday and Thursday 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and the second and fourth Saturday of each month, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Bring a driver's license and utility bill as proof of residency.
