Here's what you can do: email membership@ northwoodhills.org to provide or update your preferred email address. Alternatively, you can fill out a membership form online at northwoodhills.org/membership to confirm all your contact information. Then, make sure president@northwoodhills.org is saved as a contact or marked as a safe sender, so our emails don't go to your spam folder or get rejected by an email server. 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Holiday Crime Prevention

The holidays tend to bring an increase in package theft and BMVs (burglary of motor vehicle). Never leave your car unlocked, and never leave anything of value in it. Also, remind your contractors to lock their vehicles, secure their equipment, or park in driveways to reduce the chance of them becoming a victim.

Crimes of opportunity happen very fast and are often hard to prosecute, so deterrence is our best defense. To reduce the likelihood of falling victim to package or mail theft, here are a few tips:

- Consider signing up for UPS My Choice and Fedex
 Delivery Manager. These are free notification programs
 that inform you when a package is on the way to your
 location from one of these senders and alerts you once
 it's been delivered.
- If you're away from home a lot, it may make sense to have your packages delivered to your office, to a relative who is home more often, or to a secure "locker." These are self-service delivery locations that receive your

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Panhandling Update

The Office of Homeless Solutions is working diligently to address panhandling and homelessness issues throughout the city. Council Member Jaynie Schultz has been focused on trying to address the root causes of panhandling problems for nearly two years, and her firm belief is that handout deterrence is essential to reducing the number of panhandlers at key intersections. District 11 will be the pilot for a panhandling deterrence program currently being finalized. More information will be announced soon. The concept of the campaign is to provide an alternative to street donations by making it much easier to quickly make donations to charitable causes rather than individuals. Additionally, District 11 will be hosting a Clergy breakfast along with the Office of Homeless Solutions on Jan. 17 to work with local clergy to help preach the importance of supporting services for homeless people while stopping street donations.

The City of Dallas is encouraging residents to report sightings of coyotes in your area by calling (469) 676-9813.

When reporting a coyote in your area please provide:


- Address of the coyote encounter
- Time of encounter
- Description of encounter
- Whether hazing efforts were successful in startling and scaring off the coyote
- If the coyote was spotted eating trash or food meant for humans or pets
- Whether children or pets were present
- Any signs of illness or injury

If a coyote is exhibiting aggressive behavior like aggressively approaching, entering personal space, or attacking humans or pets, please get to a safe location and call 9-1-1 immediately.



- Check your front porch often and consider a visual doorbell to let you know when someone approaches your home.
- Consider installing a locking mailbox and don't put outgoing mail at your box. If you'll be out of town and don't have a secure mailbox, ask a neighbor or house sitter to collect your mail daily.
- Sign up for a free service from USPS called Informed Delivery, which shows you what mail and packages sent through USPS are on the way.

Look out for your neighbors! If you see a package on a neighbor's porch, let them know. Knock on their door, call them, or send a text. Once you complete a Know Your Neighbors Grid (found on the Security section of our website), this will be even easier to do.

Then you'll have access to the security patrol's out of town home check service during the holidays. Fill out the membership form on page 15 and mail it along with your check, or use the easy online membership form and dues payment option at northwoodhills.org.

What do you get for \$400 a year? Besides access to the private armed security patrol, members receive MemberMails, which are email communications that relay important information about crime alerts, neighborhood events, community meetings, lost pets, code compliance, and city services. In your first year of membership, members receive a reflective alley address sign for the back fence or gate and a "No Solicitors" plaque to mount near the doorbell. As needed, your curb address will be painted along with the custom NHHA logo for easy visibility. Membership also provides access to free paper shredding & electronics recycling events and entitles your household to a custom NHHA yard sign announcing our neighborhood's armed security and video

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Real Estate Recap and Real Talk

Is the sky falling? NO, it is not. How quickly things can change in the market from year to year! There is so much information and misinformation in the media regarding real estate, adding inflation and interest rates to the mix, and it can cause stress for many. While most people don't like the uncertainty of a shifting market, I am here to tell you, the Dallas market, specifically Northwood Hills, is strong. We have weathered storms before - literally and figuratively - and we will do it again. For 2023, do we anticipate the kind of multiple offers we saw in 2021 and early 2022? Not likely, but what you will see is continued appreciation of one of your biggest assets, your home.

The following graphic shows data from Q3 2022 vs. Q3 of 2021. Here's the gist: More inventory, similar days on market, lower list to sales price, but an almost 20% increase in average and median sales prices from the same quarter last year. The projection for next year is a healthier and more normal market, which I don't know about you, but I welcome!

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Fall Check-Up

Northwood Hills is an incredibly beautiful neighborhood, especially in fall. With the winding, tree-lined streets, striking architecture, and friendly neighbors walking with friends, furry and otherwise. To maintain the beauty and the value of our neighborhood, and your home, I recommend doing an informal home inspection. Think of it like an annual physical (you dread it but know it's necessary!). It gives you a general picture of the condition of your property and a game plan for items to address over time. With winter approaching, two important items to focus on are tree growth and aging pipes. Have your trees trimmed every 3 years, as it really pays off when a freeze comes. Check the condition of your pipes – older cast iron pipes have a life expectancy of about 50 years, and many homes still have them. Ready for more? Here's a handy checklist.

EXTERIOR:

- Clean gutters and downspouts frequently through fall
- Check windows and doors for cracks and apply caulking or weather stripping
- Fertilize lawn
- Trim shrubs and trees
- Check dryer vent and clean if necessary
- Inspect roof, attic and crawlspace for any signs of moisture or damage
- Remove outdoor hoses, insulate pipes and faucets if necessary
- Replace lightbulbs

INTERIOR:

- Check smoke detectors and fire extinguishers
- Repair any loose or damaged windows or door frames
- Inspect furnace and heating system and replace filters
- Clean air ducts
- Inspect plumbing; ensure pipes are insulated
- Donate any unwanted clothing and household items
- Clean chimney and fireplace
- Clean baseboards
- Replace lightbulbs

Roll Up Your Sleeves
