Curb Addresses

NHHA will be painting and/ or refreshing the custom curb addresses where needed at member households this spring. This is a FREE benefit of annual membership. You'll notice the crisp displays as you drive through the neighborhood, which is exactly why we do it – to help first responders, delivery personnel, and invited guests easily locate your home. Brand-new NHHA members have the custom logo and numerals added to their curb automatically within a few months after joining (unless they opt out) and existing members get theirs refreshed periodically upon request. Tim presented a recap of the 2022 financial activities of the Association, along with the proposed 2023 budget, which Members approved. We would like to thank the dedicated Members who attended, participated, and showed their appreciation for the Board's efforts. We were honored to host new residents who took the opportunity to find out more about what NHHA provides to Northwood Hills. We also appreciated our local representative who hosted the meeting and donated her time to our engaged residents. Special thanks to the volunteers who assisted with the preparations, set-up and take-down after the meeting.



Crime in Our Neighborhood

Security in Northwood Hills is a primary concern for most residents and a major focus of NHHA efforts and funding. In fact, around 75 percent of membership dues will be allocated to security patrol services in 2023.

NHHA tracks incidents of Burglary, Burglary of a Motor Vehicle (BMV), Criminal Mischief, Theft, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle (UUMV), Assault, and Robbery. In 2022, there were 55 total reported criminal incidents in Northwood Hills, with Thefts making up nearly 40 percent of the total.

Although the incidents in Northwood Hills are often classified as "minor" offenses, they're certainly not minor if they happen to you. We continue to work with GardaWorld patrol officers to make sure we're all doing everything possible to deter crime. They are keeping their eyes open for cars with valuables left inside or parked on the street for multiple days; doors, garages, or gates left unlocked or ajar; lawn equipment and bikes left out in the open; and exterior security lighting that isn't working. But, there are nearly 1,200 residences in the neighborhood, and 2 square miles of territory, so make sure you're doing your part.

From reviewing police reports, it appears that many home burglaries and vehicle burglaries are occurring without forced entry. That means criminals are finding windows, doors, garages, or vehicles unlocked. These crimes of opportunity are usually carried out very quickly, sometimes with devastating financial consequences to the victims.

NHHA has distributed numerous communications over the past few years with tips on how to avoid becoming a victim. Through articles in the Breeze, security snapshots and crime alerts in MemberMails, and a Crime and Security Guidebook available on our website, we work diligently to educate our residents. Our best advice is to make yourself a hard target; lock up and set your alarm. Let's work together to reduce crime in Northwood Hills!

Capital Improvement Items for Bond Consideration

District 11 Council Member Jaynie Schultz has asked residents to organize a list of capital improvements that we want addressed in our neighborhood and surrounding area, in anticipation of the 2024 Bond election. Examples would be street reconstruction, alley reconstruction, flooding issues, parks, or any similar projects that you believe the entire city should invest in to improve. Those neighborhoods that organize will have a much stronger opportunity to be included in the election because it is often a matter of voices represented. If you are aware of capital improvement issues that the City has failed to remedy due to size/ cost, please make sure you have first submitted it to 311 at https://dallascrm.force.com/public/servicetypes. After that, navigate to northwoodhills.org and find the Capital Improvements post for a link to an NHHA survey. If you fill that out, we will add your suggestion to the list we're compiling for our neighborhood and present it to our Council Member at the appropriate time this year.

New to Northwood Hills?

Did you purchase a home in NWH in 2022 or 2023? If so, you may qualify to receive a homestead exemption from the appraisal district. In the past, you had to own and occupy your home as your principal residence as of January 1 (and not have received a homestead exemption on any other property) in order to apply. However, under a new law, you may file for the exemption in the same year you purchase it, as long as you own and occupy your home on the date you request it. The homestead exemption entitles you to a \$25,000 reduction in taxable value for school tax purposes and other potential reductions up to 20% of value for counties, cities, and special taxing districts. Other exemptions available to homeowners include: Age 65 or older or Disabled; 100% Disabled Veteran or Surviving Spouse; and

Keep Northwood Hills Tidy

Bulk trash pick-up starts the second full week of each month in our neighborhood. It's not unusual for the city to fall behind on pick-up, especially after large storms. Since it's possible for items to be sitting out for more than a week, it's even more important that we do our part to keep bulk trash piles as tidy as possible.

Do not place items in the street or on the sidewalk. Do not place items within 5 feet of a mailbox, fence, wall, water meter, fire hydrant, utility pole, traffic sign, or parked car. Lastly, do not place items in front of a vacant lot or in any of our medians.

Make sure you are bagging everything that can be bagged so that light-weight items don't blow into your neighbors' yards and so that household items don't become enticing to critters. Remember, cardboard boxes can be broken down and placed in the weekly recycling bins.

Real Estate Recap 2022

The year 2022 started off with an extremely robust seller's market—especially here in Northwood Hills. There were multiple offers, escalating prices and disappointed buyers. Frankly, although we real estate professionals were busy and doing well, I was a little worried about where such an out of balance housing market would lead. And as the housing market continued to heat up, other prices began to rise too. A number of factors began to contribute to a worrisome inflation rate. In March, the Federal Reserve Bank reacted with a series of boosts to the Federal Funds Rate (FFR). Prior to the series of increases to the FFR, the rate was very close to zero (0.25%). In a sequence of sub-1% increases ranging from .25 to .75% the Fed raised rates to their current rate of 4.75%. As interest rates rose, the housing market began to slow down and although inventory remained low in many neighborhoods, some worried that the housing market would tank. As we all know, mortgage interest rates tend to follow a trend set by the FFR and higher mortgage rates mean that the price of a home that the median buyer can afford tends to drop. Still, on a YoY basis, the Northwood Hills market for 2022 saw an amazing increase in median sales price even though the number of properties sold decreased.

What is going to happen in 2023 for NWH? Surprisingly, although the YoY numbers are extremely favorable, the FFR increases took their toll all during 2022. Looked at on a quarterly basis the median closing price in our neighborhood trended slightly downward. Even more surprisingly the start of this year seems to bring a return to multiple offers. Still, in the short to medium term, interest rates have a big impact

on real estate prices. Although several banks (Goldman Sachs and BofA among them) have predicted 3 more rate hikes culminating in a rate of between 5.25 and 5.5% it remains to be seen how this will affect real estate. As baseball player Yogi Berra once said, "It's tough to make predictions, especially about the future". In the long run however I am very optimistic. I have no doubt that the market will adapt to whatever new rate the Fed sets this year and as inflation comes under control, the Fed will most likely stop boosting it. Keep in mind, interest rates have fluctuated wildly over the last 60 years but the median rate over all those years is still 4.25%. We expect the Northwood Hills Real Estate market to remain healthy during 2023.




Spring is Around the Corner

Mark your calendar for the Northwood Hills April Alley Clean-Up days. This annual event on the weekend before the April Bulk Trash Collection begins is set for Saturday and Sunday, April 8-9.

Each homeowner is responsible for maintaining the area from their back property line to the center of the alley. That includes trimming bushes so they don't scrape cars or obstruct the alley. Trees that overhang the alley are required to be trimmed up 15 feet to allow clearance for garbage collection trucks.

Trash, debris, and stacked bags harbor pests, so use this opportunity to place them out for bulk trash collection. Clean alleys improve property values, deter criminal activity, and enhance safety. While you're out there, meet your alley neighbors. They are your allies in helping reduce alley crime.

continued from page 5 Partially Disabled Veterans. The deadline for filing a Residence Homestead Exemption Application is April 30 of the year for which you are claiming the exemption. Late applications will be accepted if filed no later than 2 years after the tax delinquency date for the tax year you are claiming the exemption. If you are a single or married homeowner filing together, you may be eligible to apply online. There is no fee to file an exemption application (or late exemption application). For more information, visit dallascad.org or call 214-631-0910.

No Solicitation Policy

As part of NHHA's crime-prevention efforts, members are eligible for a free No Solicitors plaque for mounting near your front door. It's against city ordinance for a person to ring the doorbell, knock on the door, or leave material for the purpose of home solicitation, if a sign is exhibited in a conspicuous place on or near the main entrance to the residence. If a solicitor fails to adhere to this policy, please call the security patrol.

Did you know there are other rules for solicitors? No one can solicit prior to 9am or later than 30 minutes after sunset, Monday through Saturday. No one can solicit at any time on a Sunday, New Year's Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, or Christmas Day. Please note that persons representing a charitable, non-profit organization are exempt from the city ordinance.

Even with a sign clearly posted, you may have solicitors who don't think it applies to them. They are sometimes pushy and alarming and could even be criminals posing as solicitors. For these reasons, we recommend you don't open the door, but instead speak to them through the door to let them know you're home and not interested.

If you feel in any way alarmed or threatened, CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY. Members can then call the security patrol. If an officer is on duty, report the solicitor and the officer will follow up to make sure they have legitimate business in the neighborhood.





FAQ - Medians

We periodically get asked questions about the medians inside Northwood Hills. Here's what you need to know! NHHA pays for the maintenance of the median at the corner of Spring Valley and Hillcrest, the median at the corner of Belt Line and Hillcrest, the medians that run along Meandering Way toward Belt Line, and the medians on Meadowcreek, east and west of Hillcrest. The median on Elmridge, west of Hillcrest, is maintained by The Greenway, which is a volunteer group of nearby residents. NHHA contributes an amount annually toward their operations.

The City of Dallas actually owns the medians and NHHA has an arrangement with the City to handle maintenance. We do not own the land, but we bear the cost of maintenance for the betterment of the neighborhood. When a median is damaged by an automobile accident, we have to motivate the City to pursue an insurance claim since we have no legal standing to do it on our own.

What we're able to accomplish at any median is a function of the location and what amenities are present there. For example, the corner of Belt Line and Hillcrest has no access to water, so that limits our options. We don't have electricity run to any of our medians, so all our sprinkler controllers are battery-powered. We recently began using the services of a new landscaping vendor, and we look forward to improvements at many of our medians this year.

Why doesn't NHHA use NextDoor for its communications? NHHA utilizes MemberMails to connect directly to our members through email. Almost every single member has an email address for us to reach out to with important information. Not all members use the NextDoor website and the neighborhood boundaries were set up originally on NextDoor in such a way that incorrectly divides the neighborhood at Spring Valley. So, broadcasting information to "Northwood Hills" per their boundaries would eliminate all our residents south of Spring Valley. By using email, NHHA is able to target almost all of our members. You can also refer to our website www.northwoodhills.org for updates.


