Holiday Crime Prevention

The holidays tend to bring an increase in package theft and BMVs (burglary of motor vehicle). Never leave your car unlocked, and never leave anything of value in it. Also, remind your contractors to lock their vehicles, secure their equipment, or park in driveways to reduce the chance of them becoming a victim.

Crimes of opportunity happen very fast and are often hard to prosecute, so deterrence is our best defense. To reduce the likelihood of falling victim to package or mail theft, here are a few tips:

- Consider signing up for UPS My Choice and Fedex
 Delivery Manager. These are free notification programs
 that inform you when a package is on the way to your
 location from one of these senders and alerts you once it's
 been delivered.
- If you're away from home a lot, it may make sense to have your packages delivered to your office, to a relative who is home more often, or to a secure "locker." These are self-service delivery locations that receive your packages and keep them secure until you're ready to retrieve them (Amazon and Fedex are a couple of options for Lockers).

Why Wait? Your 2024 Membership Can Start Today

If you're contemplating joining the Northwood Hills Homeowners Association, don't wait 'til 2024... join right now and your membership starts immediately! Then you'll have access to the security patrol's out of town home check service during the holidays. Fill out the membership form on page 15 and mail it along with your check, or use the easy online membership form and dues payment options at **northwoodhills.org.**

What do you get for \$400 a year? Besides access to the private armed security patrol, members receive MemberMails, which are email communications that relay important information about crime alerts, neighborhood events, community meetings, lost pets, code compliance, and city services. In your first year of membership, members receive a reflective alley address sign for the back fence or gate and a "No Solicitors" plaque to mount near the doorbell. As needed, your curb address will be painted along with the custom NHHA logo for easy visibility. Membership also provides

Oak Wilt Education

Northwood Hills has suffered from oak wilt in the past, and the best advice for avoiding this disease is to trim at the right time, use a knowledgeable provider, and paint the cuts if deemed necessary. The pruning of oak trees should be avoided from February to June and should be performed outside those months only by a licensed arborist using sterilized equipment, proper cuts, and proper sealing of wounds. One of the least hazardous periods for pruning is during the coldest days in midwinter.

Winterize Your Home

Summer temperatures stretched into Fall, but Winter is rapidly approaching. If you haven't already, begin planning the steps you'll take to winterize your home. Here are some things to consider as we enter the colder months of the year:

- Clean your gutters. If your gutters are full of leaves and debris, they'll trap water from rainfall. When the first freeze happens, that water turns to ice, which can weigh down the gutters and cause them to pull away from the house.
- Service your furnace. A check-up can ensure your furnace will be functional all season long. After months of not being used, it's helpful to have it cleaned and inspected before you'll need it most. Don't forget to change your filter.
- Seal drafts. Weather-stripping and/or caulking your doors and windows is an affordable way to conserve energy and keep your home comfortable.
- Replace missing roof shingles and seal vents. If water
 penetrates your house through openings in the roof, it can be
 especially harmful in the winter if the water freezes in your attic.

Cutting Through the Noise – Real Estate Recap

I don't know about you, but it sure is hard to cut through all the noise in the media about the housing market. Of course, we have to remember we have local and national news giving us general, broad-sweeping information and not specific information pertinent to our neighborhood or the surrounding areas. The landscape of the Dallas housing market has shifted. Mortgage rates have risen, impacting both buyers and sellers. While rates are still relatively low compared to historical averages, they are higher than what we've seen in previous years. For buyers, this means higher monthly mortgage payments. The increased interest rates have made homeownership a bit less affordable, and some potential buyers may need to adjust their budgets or housing expectations because of it. As well, the higher interest rates have removed for many the sense of urgency to jump on a house the day it hits the market. Buyers understand their dollar is costing them more than it did in previous years and aren't as quick to overlook deferred maintenance or repair

issues. They are definitely looking to negotiate pricing and terms of an offer. So, if you see a home on the market for more than 21 days, don't automatically think something is wrong with it. Sometimes, the right buyer just hasn't come along.



Sellers are experiencing a market that's becoming more balanced. Properties are still in demand, but they may not sell as quickly as we've seen in the last 3 years. The advantage is no longer solely with the sellers, and they will need to be more competitive with pricing and property condition.


The last couple of years we have seen properties sell quicker, with multiple offers, and inventory remained low. This year specifically we have seen some properties sell fast, with multiple offers, while others stayed on the market for longer days than recent years. When talking with clients, friends, coworkers, and family, I have shared that if you remove 2020 – 2022 data, and look at days on market now and before, *continued on pg 10*

they are super close. Dallas remains an attractive destination for those seeking a vibrant job market and a favorable cost of living. We continue to have large corporations looking to move their headquarters to Texas, and specifically the Dallas area.

Pricing and preparation have never been more important in this shifting market. The Dallas housing market is resilient, but the impact of interest rate increases in 2023 is a reminder that real estate dynamics can change. Both buyers and sellers should stay informed about market conditions and mortgage rate trends to make informed decisions in this evolving landscape. The following graphic shows data from Q3 2023 vs. Q3 of 2022. There was less activity overall, but sales prices remain strong.

- **Prepare your outside faucets.** Disconnect hoses and splitters from the spigot. Install a hose bib cover on each outdoor fixture.
- Check your fireplace. Consider having the chimney professionally cleaned to remove last year's build-up of creosote and ash. Inspect the interior for cracks and make sure the chimney cap is in good shape.
- Monitor your thermostat. If you're planning a holiday vacation, resist the temptation to turn off your thermostat while you're gone. You not only run the risk of freezing pipes if there's no heat in the house, but your system will have to work too hard to get things toasty again when you return. Lowering the temperature while you're away is safer than a dormant furnace.
- Pack up the patio furniture. It's unlikely you'll be spending much time outside in freezing temps, so pack up the patio furniture, or at least the cushions, and store them during the winter to extend their life.

- Check your front porch often and consider a visual doorbell to let you know when someone approaches your home.
- Consider installing a locking mailbox and don't put outgoing mail at your box. If you'll be out of town and don't have a secure mailbox, ask a neighbor or house sitter to collect your mail daily.
- Sign up for a free service from USPS called Informed Delivery, which shows you what mail and packages sent through USPS are on the way.

Look out for your neighbors! If you see a package on a neighbor's porch, let them know. Knock on their door, call them, or send a text. Once you complete a Know Your Neighbors Grid (found on the Security section of our website), this will be even easier to do.




