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Real Estate Recap

Housing fundamentals in Northwood Hills still show strength. The second quarter of 2025 (April, May and June) had 12 sales reported in MLS. Reported sales prices ranged from \$660,000 to \$1,349,000 and price per square foot from \$228 to \$367, with an average price per square foot of \$307. Average days on market were 34 and the list to sales price ratio was 101%. Of the 12 houses sold, 7 sold at or above list price with an average of 6 days on the market. As of the time of this writing in late July, there are 16 homes for sale in Northwood Hills in MLS. List prices range from \$599,000 to \$3,450,000 and prices per square foot from \$237 to \$516 with an average price of \$362. There are 4 houses under contract. Of the 20 homes, 9 have had price reductions. That is consistent with the nationwide average of 20% seeing price cuts. If a home is not priced correctly the market will let you know pretty quickly.

Bottom line: more supply, softer demand, but no signs of a housing bubble- just a more balanced market.

Mortgage rates remain stuck in the high 6%-7% range. The Mortgage Bankers Association forecasts gradual decreases through early 2026, but analysts don't expect the return of 3% mortgage rates in the future. Higher mortgage rates are proving to be a little bit of a disincentive for move-up buyers who have low rates.

When it comes to renovations that actually pay off in Texas, curb appeal is a big one. In a 2024 study by the Journal of continued page 5

Light Construction of cost versus value report, replacing your entry door and front landscaping ranked number 2 in most profitable. Good News! There is a new bill under consideration called the "More Homes On The Market Act" that would have a meaningful impact on Sellers. Under the current law, which was set in 1997, a single person could exclude \$250,000 and a couple could exclude \$500,000 from capital gains tax on the sale of their main home. The proposed bill would raise the exclusion amount to \$500,000 for a single person and \$1,000,000 for a couple. The bill has to be passed, but it has bipartisan political support and support from the real estate community.

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Stop the Spread



It's hard to step outside for even a moment these days without getting a visit from a mosquito or two. The familiar resulting itch lets you know you've been a target, but it's not just that minor annoyance we need to try and avoid. West Nile Virus (WNV) is most commonly transmitted to humans by mosquitoes. While most people will exhibit no symptoms after contracting it, and only about 20% will develop a fever with other symptoms, there is a small possibility that WNV can lead to a serious, sometimes fatal, neurologic illness. Over the years, multiple people have died in Dallas County as a result of the virus.

There are no medications to treat a WNV infection, so prevention is key. Remember the Four D's:

- DEET: Use insect repellants that contain DEET or other EPA-approved repellants. Whenever you're outside, even for a short time, protect yourself.
- DRESS: Wear long, loose, light-colored clothing when outside.

- DRAIN: Remove any standing water. Change water in birdbaths, fountains and plant saucers often. Clean gutters so leaves can't hold moisture. Use mosquito dunks where necessary.
- DUSK/DAWN: Consider staying indoors during dusk and dawn hours when mosquitoes are most active.

The City of Dallas works to prevent the spread of mosquito-transmitted diseases through their Mosquito Control Program. They trap and collect mosquitoes for testing, monitor known breeding sites and apply larvicide, punish Code violations of standing water, treat storm drains, disseminate educational materials, and spray for West Nile Virus in neighborhoods when mosquito pools test positive. When WNV is confirmed, spraying typically occurs overnight between 9pm and 5am. Residents are encouraged to stay indoors during that time to avoid contact with the spray. The trucks drive down residential streets but do not travel in the alleys. If your pet uses an outdoor water bowl, you should clean it out and replace the water after a spraying. NHHA Members receive email alerts if the City is scheduled to spray inside Northwood Hills.

All mosquitoes need water to reproduce, so the best thing you can do on your own property to prevent breeding and the spread of WNV is to eliminate standing water. The worst offenders are unkempt swimming pools, stagnant ponds, birdbaths, empty containers that collect rainwater, clogged gutters, and French drains. If you can't empty the water, use a mosquito dunk. NHHA has some on hand to help stop the spread of mosquito-transmitted diseases. Reach out to us if you'd like a free one.

If you notice standing water in ditches, vacant lots or on neighborhood property, please report it to 311. Remember the Four D's, keep an eye on your property, and be on the lookout for problem areas around you. Together we can work to stop the spread.

Watch Your Car

Thefts of vehicles and vehicle accessories and burglaries of motor vehicles are typically quick crimes of opportunity. Sometimes homeowners take for granted the importance of securing their automobiles, especially when they think they'll be "in and out in a jiffy!" Contractors are also notorious for leaving their vehicles and equipment unsecured when they're working at a property. Criminals love to capitalize on these types of oversights and it's time we drive them out of our neighborhood. Are you following these easy steps to reduce your risk of becoming a victim?

- Lock your car at all times
- Keep windows rolled up
- Remove valuables from your vehicle
- · Don't leave your running car unattended
- Park in the garage
- Remind contractors to secure their vehicles
- If you have to park outside overnight, park in a well-lit location and don't leave garage door openers in the car

We know it's tempting to park on the street when you're making a quick stop at home, but it's important to remember that crimes of opportunity are just that – opportunities. Take away the criminal's opportunity and you exponentially reduce your chance of being victimized. Garage too full to park in? Time for some

Make a commitment to rid yourself of excess stuff – host a garage sale, donate items in good condition, and take advantage of the free monthly bulk trash pickup provided by the city for items that have worn out their use. It's never the victim's fault when their property is stolen, but we encourage our residents to make themselves hard targets so criminals leave the neighborhood. 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


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Northwood Hills Boundaries and Areas
