

Then you'll have access to the security patrol's out of town home check service during the holidays. Fill out the membership form on page 15 and mail it along with your check, or use the easy online membership form and dues payment options at *northwoodhills.org*.

What do you get for \$400 a year? Besides access to the private armed security patrol, members receive MemberMails, which are email communications that relay important information about crime alerts, neighborhood events, community meetings, lost pets, code compliance, and city services. In your first year of membership, members receive a reflective alley address sign for the back fence or gate and a "No Solicitors" plaque to mount near the doorbell. As needed, your curb address will be painted along with the custom NHHA logo for easy visibility. Membership also provides access to free paper shredding & electronics recycling events and entitles your household to a custom NHHA yard sign announcing our neighborhood's armed security and video surveillance. New benefits and members-only events are added regularly.

Real Estate Recap

A Neighborhood with Legacy and Leverage

Tucked between Preston Road and Coit Road, Northwood Hills remains one of North Dallas's most desirable enclaves—defined by its towering trees, generous lots, and enduring charm. As 2025 winds down, this storied neighborhood reflects the broader Dallas market shift toward balance. Typical lot values now hover around \$1 million, a testament to land scarcity and long-term desirability. Builders are still circling for teardown opportunities, though the pace has cooled from the frenzy of 2021–2022. The market is maturing: homeowners are more selective, buyers more analytical, and everyone is watching the data.

Inventory and Buyer Behavior

Inventory is gradually loosening—still limited, but more forgiving than it's been in years. Homes that once attracted multiple offers in a weekend are now taking 45–60 days to find the right match. Buyers are crunching numbers with sharper pencils: comparing lot value vs. rebuild cost, weighing rate volatility, and reconsidering timelines. Many are deciding that a beautifully maintained original home on a full lot beats paying a premium for a new build whose costs remain 15–20 % higher than before 2022.

Rates, Affordability & the Premium of Location

Even in the luxury tier, mortgage rates matter. Savvy buyers are mixing cash and creative financing to offset high borrowing costs, while sellers who lead with realism are seeing results. Yet Northwood Hills continues to outperform nearby ZIPs because of its location, lot size, and school access. The neighborhood's mature trees, quiet streets, and generous setbacks safeguard its value—no matter how national headlines swing.

Looking Ahead to Early 2026

Expect continued normalization —not decline!

- Lot values: likely to hold at or above the \$1 million mark, with modest appreciation if rates ease.
- Custom rebuilds: poised to rebound by spring 2026 as financing stabilizes.
- Move-in-ready homes: will command premiums; dated properties will need strategic pricing and presentation.

Northwood Hills isn't chasing trends—it sets them. In a market evolving from speed to strategy, hyper-local expertise matters more than ever.







Holiday Crime Prevention

The holidays tend to bring an increase in package theft and BMVs (burglary of motor vehicle). Never leave your car unlocked, and never leave anything of value in it. Also, remind your contractors to lock their vehicles, secure their equipment, or park in driveways to reduce the chance of them becoming a victim.

Crimes of opportunity happen very fast and are often hard to prosecute, so deterrence is our best defense. To reduce the likelihood of falling victim to package or mail theft, here are a few tips:

- Consider signing up for UPS My Choice and Fedex Delivery Manager. These are free notification programs that inform you when a package is on the way to your location from one of these senders and alerts you once it's been delivered.
- If you're away from home a lot, it may make sense to have your packages delivered to your office, to a relative who is home more often, or to a secure "locker." These are self-service delivery locations that receive your packages and keep them secure until you're ready to retrieve them. (Amazon and Fedex are a couple of options for Lockers).
- Check your front porch often and consider a visual doorbell to let you know when someone approaches your home.
- Consider installing a locking mailbox and don't put outgoing mail at your box. If you'll be out of town and don't have a secure mailbox, ask a neighbor or house sitter to collect your mail daily.

 Sign up for a free service from USPS called Informed Delivery, which shows you what mail and packages sent through USPS are on the way.

Look out for your neighbors! If you see a package on a neighbor's porch, let them know. Knock on their door, call them, or send a text. Once you complete a Know Your Neighbors Grid (found in the Security section of our website), this will be even easier to do.

Walking Safely in Northwood Hills

For many residents of Northwood Hills, walking is a form of relaxation and exercise. Whether walking alone or with friends, children or pets, this activity is something we seem to enjoy. However, there are rules to be followed and sensible actions to be undertaken that will keep everyone safe and secure.

Section 552.006(b) of the Texas Transportation Code outlines that, where there is no sidewalk, a pedestrian should walk along the left side of the roadway, facing oncoming traffic. This is a fundamental safety practice, especially in a neighborhood such as Northwood Hills that lacks sidewalks on many streets. Consider walking single file, or with children and pets on your left side. This increases your ability to see and react quickly to oncoming dangers. You never know if someone behind you may make a mistake, but if you are facing oncoming traffic, your visibility to dangers and hazards is greatly enhanced. Always assume that drivers may not see you.

Other helpful tips include wearing appropriate clothing at night, like brightly-colored and reflective pieces. Avoid distractions like using your phone or listening to music in headphones, which might prevent you from noticing hazards. These common sense suggestions can help keep everyone safe and eager for the next outing.

RISD Bond Election Results

Residents of Dallas and Richardson who reside inside Richardson Independent School District attendance boundaries cast their votes recently regarding a proposed Bond election. The bond was broken into 3 parts, each voted on separately, and all 3 passed. Projects paid for by the bond will impact all RISD schools, but specifically for Northwood Hills Elementary, the following improvements are planned:

- Air conditioning and heating updates
- Energy conservation equipment installation
- Exterior improvements
- New furniture
- Playground improvements
- Restroom renovations
- Technology devices for students and staff

For homes in Northwood Hills with an average market value of \$1M, the bond's passing could potentially result in an estimated annual property tax increase of \$250-\$300. Homeowners age 65 or older who already have their property tax levy frozen should not see an increase related to the bond's passing, however.


Communications/Marketing – create/update content for our website and quarterly newsletter; manage social media posts; develop sponsorship and underwriting opportunities.


